Section 1: Bureau / Division Reports

Noteworthy Police Work

Sgt. Zdru recognized Officer DeAngelis for his work assisting the Connecticut State Police during a pursuit of vehicle and suspects wanted in connection with a larceny in Westport. Officer DeAngelis was able to successfully deploy stop sticks as the vehicle exited exit 23, resulting in the vehicle stopping and the suspects taken into custody.

Sgt. Paris recognized Officer Beattie for his work stopping a vehicle that fled a traffic stop, struck the officer's vehicle and then engaged officers in a pursuit onto I-95. The vehicle was stopped and the operator arrested.

Sgt. Gunter recognized Officer Wells for his assistance during a Bridgeport robbery investigation. Officer Wells responded to the scene and assisted Bridgeport Police by tracking the suspect to an area in Fairfield where video surveillance tapes showed the suspect and getaway vehicle. Several days later Officer Wells located a vehicle matching the description, conducted a surveillance and identified the suspect from the robbery. He stopped the car and developed information that was passed to Bridgeport Police.

Patrol**17-42346 | 4:12 AM | Pursuit-Stolen MV | Rubis, C | I95 Nb 23 To 24**

Officer Rubis was on active patrol when he observed a 2018 Jaguar-F Pace-black-SUV exit I95 Southbound at Exit 22. Upon turning onto North Benson Road the operator did not signal a left turn and he further observed the rear registration plate was not bolted and hanging. Rubis observed the Jaguar quickly turned left re-entering I-95 at the northbound ramp reaching speed of 65mph and attempted a M/V stop in the area of Exit 23 on I-95 Northbound. The vehicle exited at Exit 24 Kings Highway and continued onto Black Rock Turnpike south toward Bridgeport picking up speed toward Canfield Ave. Rubis radioed speed and direction and terminated the pursuit due to reckless manner of operation. A follow up by the Stratford Police department discovered the vehicle was stolen from a residence overnight and not yet reported. The keys were in the vehicle.

Officer Wells was dispatched to Greenwich after suspects fled the scene of an accident in Greenwich. On scene investigation revealed 2 suspects from the Bronx broke into a Greenwich house then fled in a car and later crashed the car on the Merritt Parkway. Shortly after another vehicle was stolen by the suspects and they were stopped by Greenwich Police and taken into custody. Officer Wells searched the burglary scene for other possible suspects, none were found.

ECC received a call of a red sedan pulling onto the front yard while the neighbors are away for Thanksgiving. On scene officers found the vehicle abandoned and reported stolen out of New York. Officer Wells and K-9 Jagger responded to start a track. Officers located a suspect walking in the area on foot and traced him back to the stolen car. Suspect taken into custody and charged with the stolen car and active warrants.

Officer Wells was dispatched to Stratford after the Connecticut State Police pursued a stolen vehicle south on Merritt Parkway, which crashed between exits 53 and 52. Two male subjects ran from the vehicle into a wooded area. The same two subjects then burglarized a home in Stratford and took a vehicle. The subjects then crashed that vehicle on Pepperidge Circle in Stratford. Stratford Police requested that Officer Wells start a track at the scene of the vehicle that crashed on Pepperidge Circle. Connecticut State Police /Stratford Police and Trumbull

Police all had K9's on scene. Stratford Police later learned that a female gave the suspects a ride to New Haven.

ECC received a call of a stabbing at a residence on Pequot Ave. Multiple officers responded, on scene investigation determined a verbal argument between stepbrothers turned physical inside of their parent's home which led to one brother stabbing the other in the hand with serrated butter knife. Both brothers charged with Assault 2nd and Disorderly Conduct, one brother transported to the hospital for hand injury.

ECC received a call of a possible over dose inside a residence. Officers arrived and located a subject in the basement not breathing. Officer Nadeau began to perform CPR while awaiting the arrival of AMR and the Fairfield Fire Department. Officer Mazzocchi administered Narcan.

AMR arrived on scene and administered additional aide. Subject's condition was unchanged and later pronounced deceased on scene. The death investigation was turned over to the Detective Bureau.

17-46145 | 0600 AM | Pursuit-Stolen MV | Fenton, S | Congress St. @ Route 15

Westport Police radioed via the hotline that they are in pursuit of a stolen vehicle a 2016 Mazda CX9, color black stolen out of Greenwich, north on Redding Rd. Later updated to Hillside Rd. Officer Fenton took a position at Black Rock Tpk and Congress St and moments later a small black SUV approached the intersection at a high rate of speed and turned north onto Black Rock Tpk. Officer Fenton engaged in pursuit eastbound on Congress St. The suspect vehicle was traveling at high rate of speed when a CSP Trooper entered Congress Street in the area of the Route 15 rest stop and became the lead vehicle. Officer Fenton lost site of the suspect vehicle and terminated the pursuit when he observed the CSP in pursuit entering Route 15 North bound.

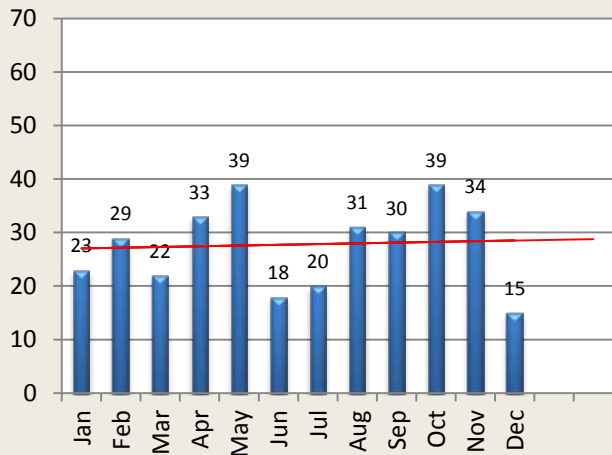
