
On Saturday July 9, 2022 at approximately 10:30pm the Fairfield Police Emergency Communications Center received several 911 calls reporting shots fired at the banquet hall to Calvin United Church located on Kings Hwy East near Hibiscus Street.

First arriving officers located an unresponsive male victim in the hall and immediately began life saving measures. The victim was transported to Saint Vincent's Medical Center by AMR where he died as a result of his injuries.

This was an isolated incident, which all of the evidence indicates that the suspect knew the victim and fled the scene shortly after the shooting.

The Fairfield Police Detective Bureau along with the Connecticut State Police Western District Major Crimes Squad are actively investigating this incident.

Our department sends its deepest condolences to the family for this senseless loss of life.







#### Calls For Service - 2021




