Section 1: Bureau / Division Reports

Noteworthy Police Work

Sergeant Kline recognized Officer Chamberlain for his apprehension of a suspect wanted by the U.S. Marshall's Service on a warrant for Violation of Probation.

Lieutenant Bloch recognized Sergeant Riendeau, Officer Kaesmann and Officer Zerella for their arrest of two subjects on narcotic charges.

Sergeant Irizarry recognized Officer McGrath and Officer Fuller for their investigation during a traffic stop that resulted in the arrest of one person for Illegal Possession of a Firearm by a Felon, Possession of Drug Paraphernalia and Possession of Marijuana. A firearm was seized. A second subject was charged with various motor vehicle misdemeanors.

Sergeant VanDerheyden recognized Officer Wells, Officer Jenkins and Officer Demotses for their work during an investigation into a possible suicidal subject. Officers located the victim in a closed garage with a vehicle running. The victim was not responsive. Officer Jenkins climbed through a window into the garage to gain access to the victim. The three officers then pulled the victim out of the garage. She was transported to the hospital for treatment.

Lieutenant Bloch recognized Sergeant Riendeau for his arrest of a subject on narcotic charges.

Sergeant Gunter recognized Officer Koukoulas, Officer McGrath and Officer Fuller for their investigation into a shoplifting complaint that resulted in the arrest of a subject for Theft of a Firearm, Felon in Possession of Ammunition, Larceny 6th and Possession of Marijuana.

Lieutenant Bloch recognized Sergeant Riendeau for his observations that led to identification of a subject who had been involved in a drug deal at a local gas station.

Lieutenant Bloch recognized TC Erazmus, TC DeMoura, TC Clancy and TC Atkins for their work during one of the recent storms. The call volume was very heavy and the telecommunicators remained professional and worked as a team to answer the numerous calls.
