

Officer Beattie followed up on a car break-in, which occurred the previous day on Royal Avenue, where a window was smashed and a purse was stolen. He developed a lead and conducted an interview which led to a Search Warrant of a suspect's home (The lead was developed by Officer Beattie after Officer Krushinski and Katz arrested the suspect the previous day for 3 prawn warrants)

The subject was found to have property on him belonging to the victim on Royal Avenue. The interview of the subject led to a search warrant on Orland Street in Bridgeport. During the execution of the search warrant, Officer Beattie and the members of the detective bureau recovered stolen property and tools which were used in the commission of the crime
