He was given the money and left without incident. An area search was negative. The ensuing investigation quickly lead to a suspect. On Friday 10/23 **Detective Hector Irizzary** and **Detective Peter Bravo** set up surveillance in West Haven at the home of the suspect's girlfriend. After about three hours the suspect appeared. He was taken into custody. When asked to identify himself the suspect gave his name and added, "I'm the guy who robbed the bank yesterday". Arrest made.
